PLANNED ROAD CLOSURE NOTIFICATION - 23507 Matthew Lane,
Low Bradley

North Yorkshire County Council inform that there will be a road closure in place for a period of 5 days between 16th December 2019 and 20th December 2019 for a new water main installation.

The Canal & River Trust have advised that work on the tow path which was due to be completed at the end of December has been delayed and it is hoped completion will now be the end of February. The car park will be out of bounds until the work is completed when the surface will be re-laid.

In accordance with Regulation 26 of the Town and Country Planning (Local Planning) (England) Regulations 2012 (as amended), Craven District Council advise that they have formally adopted its Local Plan at a meeting of the Full Council on 12th November 2019. The formal Adoption Statement is provided on the CDC website.

Voting in the General Election takes place on Thursday 12th December 2019. A notice of the candidates is on the village notice boards and can be found on the Craven District Council website.

The first meeting of the Footpath group took place on 13th November and was very well attended. The volunteers will survey the footpaths within the Parish boundary and report any issues to NYCC. From YesteryearTaken from the Minutes of Bradleys Both Parish Council meeting January 1907

It was proposed by Mr Green, seconded by Mr Blades, that we accept the offer of the Bradley Lodge of the Sweet William Independent Order of the Golden Fleece to loan to the Council for lighting purposes the sum of fifty pounds at the rate of three pounds ten shillings per cent, per annum the principal and interest to be repaid at the end of ten years.

The Council also resolved to offer a reward of 2/6d to any person who would give such information as would lead to the conviction of any person who may at any time be guilty of injuring the lamps.

11th January 1907

Friday evening, Jan 11th 1907 marked the lighting of the streets of Bradley for the first time, the

Chairman of the Council, Mr Wilkinson Hudson, leading off by lighting the first lamp.

The event was commemorated by the Councillors and their wives at the residence of the clerk , Mr Edwin Bray, by a social evening and supper.
