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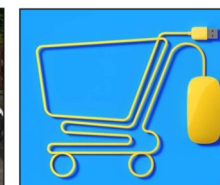

### Chair's update

In May I took on the role of chairman of Bradleys Both Parish Council with some apprehension. David Cohn, to whom many thanks are due, has steered the council through the tortuous process of formulating the Neighbourhood Development Plan and for many years now has effortlessly chaired our monthly meetings. Greetings are also due to the most recent addition to the council, Sarah Scully, who brings with her extensive experience as a lawyer and does much to lower the average age of the councillors!

Amongst my early jobs was getting to grips with the council's possessions. In doing so, I was struck by the generosity of earlier generations which has done so much for our village. Both the burial ground (as to which more below) and the village hall (which is owned by an independent body of trustees) were given to the village by the Dukes of Devonshire in the nineteenth century when they were by far the largest landowners in the parish. The playing fields were given to the village more recently by the generosity of the Green family. Without these landmarks our village would look very different and would be deprived of much of what makes it such an attractive community.

Safeguarding and maintaining this inheritance is a major part of the work of the parish council. We receive an annual precept from the local authority (formerly Craven District Council but now the newly formed North Yorkshire Council) of just over £20,000. That may sound like quite a lot but running repairs and the maintenance of our inheritance along with grants to worthwhile causes in the village easily take up our income which, more recently, has been eroded by inflation (as we all know, to our cost). For example, the football pitch on the playing fields suffers from drainage problems so that the Football Club has been forced to give up its use. The parish council is determined to restore and drain the pitch properly so the club can return but that promises to be a long drawn out - and expensive - project.

Another striking feature of our village is the willingness of so many to pitch in and help with events such as the annual village show (due to take place this year on Sunday 10<sup>th</sup> September and other events which take place throughout the year such as the cinema in the village hall. Special mention should be made here of the efforts of Bradley in Bloom. Over a year ago, the parish council took back in hand the remainder of the burial ground which has now been landscaped and planted by Bradley in Bloom using the old field name, Sweet Croft. One of our longer term objectives as a parish council is to encourage the involvement of a younger generation in all these activities.

As this edition of Bradley News goes to press we have just had the result of the referendum on the Neighbourhood Development Plan. It is good to see that so many took the trouble to vote on this important issue and heartening that the Plan was approved by a convincing majority. Thanks are due to all those who have been involved in its preparation over the last ten years and much work lies ahead in ensuring that it is implemented properly

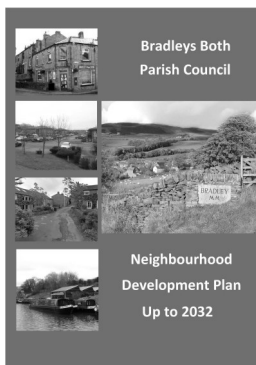

## Referendum result

Thank you to all who voted in the Neighbourhood Plan Referendum.

The Plan has taken over ten years to get to this Point. Once adopted the Neighbourhood Plan has to be taken into consideration, along with North Yorkshire Council's Local Plan, when any planning applications are received for Low and High Bradley. The policies in the Plan relating to Housing, Environment, Highways, Community Facilities, Employment and Infrastructure are there to protect the village to ensure the conservation area and surrounding landscape remains the pleasant area we live in. The result of the referendum is opposite.
